One in particular was waking up to his first day of competition in the finals, full of anticipation and excitement, wondering what the outcome would be.

Michael Evans, from Stagecoach South Wales, was keen to get going, as he told Middle Walk Times...

"As a first-time competitor at BDoY, I didn't really know what to expect, but what an experience it has been. The atmosphere around the hotel was electric all weekend with a buzz of excitement from the gathering of like-minded people, sharing tales from behind the wheel and life in the bus lane.

"On Sunday morning I had one of the later starting times so took the opportunity to ride the route on one of the buses, just to see what was involved. It looked straightforward but the big question was how was I going to tackle it? "I was delighted to receive the trophies and prize money, but the highlight of the day was being congratulated by my fellow bus drivers from bus companies from all over the country, drivers who were strangers to me but they

congratulated me none the less. Thank you to them all.

"I often joke with my grandchildren that I am the best bus driver, so it was great to see their faces when they saw my trophies!

"When I got back to work at Stagecoach South Wales, I expected to receive a friendly ribbing but the positive comments from both colleagues and passengers has been overwhelming and I am very grateful.

"Thank you BDoY, especially the organisers and marshals, it was a great event and I hope to be able to defend my title in 2023!"
